4. FIRST-AID MEASURES

First Aid Measures

Eye Contact Causes burns and may result in permanent injury to eyes including blindness.

Immediately flush eyes with water for 15-20 minutes, while holding eyelids open. Remove contact lenses, if present, after the first 5 minutes, then continue rinsing eye.

Seek medical attention at once.

Skin ContactCauses corrosive burns. Brief exposure may cause irritation and defatting of the skin.

Exposures not promptly washed off may lead to toxic effects similar to ingestion. Harmful if absorbed through skin. Take off contaminated clothing. Rinse skin immediately with plenty of water for 15-20 minutes. Call a poison control center or doctor for further treatment

Inhalation Mists and vapors can irritate the throat and respiratory tract. High vapor concentrations may
